Transaid is an international development charity that identifies, champions, implements and shares local transport solutions which improve access to basic services and economic opportunity for poor people in developing countries.

In October, Mark Binns, Managing Director attended Transaid Annual Showcase in the presence of Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal. At the event Princess Ann underlined the importance of creating sustainable development projects which can have lasting impact on communities.

In the 12 month period between 1st May 2014 and 30th May 2015, the charity's emergency transport programmes in Uganda, Zambia, Madagascar and Nigeria recruited and trained over 1,200 volunteer emergency transport drivers, transported more than 8,800 people living in rural areas to healthcare facilities and equipped almost 500 community health workers with bicycles and training.
